



Annual Report 2015

Child's Play Foundation continues to present a Christ centered community ministry to families and therapists alike. Because of pressing family health problems and a limited time to provide psycho therapy Penny Phares has decreased the hours of volunteer practice over the year. Families are referred to other agencies if they want their care to be funded by Medicaid or insurance, but if the caller is willing to schedule on Tuesdays on a fee for service basis, this agency is willing to meet their need.

In 2015 Child's Play Foundation availed 81 hours of play therapy, individual and family counseling to 22 individuals and families at Isaiah's Place.

Working toward our mission of providing counseling for children and families in a Christ centered environment, providing more opportunities for parents and counselors to learn play therapy and providing educational opportunities for young families, the following outcomes were realized;

Patient visits through Isaiah's Place in 2015

- 22 individuals received counseling
- 81 patient visits were scheduled
- 51 patient visits were completed

Workshops / Community Outreach and Education

Sand Tray Trainings held at Isaiah's Place: January 31, February 28, June 13, September 26, and November 14, 2015. Over 5 sessions there were 20 participants.

Board of Directors -In our desire to have quarterly board meetings, the Board of Directors was able to meet **2/13/15, 5/15/15, 8/14/15, and 10/30/15**. Board members also participate in community outreach / financial support. Donna Taudte –Chair, Dee Dixon - Vice Chairman, June Proffit- Secretary and Marty Wright – treasurer, continue in their offices. Barbara Washburn is a member at large. Penny Phares, is the Clinical Director.

The website – www.childsplayfoundation.org continues to be a resource for potential clients and students and gives Child's Play a place in the market. Client families and students are able to access information about services, read the quarterly newsletter and read Penny's opinion (blog) that might be helpful to the healthcare and mental health community. It is easier to assess the benefit when phone calls reveal that they first accessed Child's Play Foundation online. It is a continued cost savings on postage usually spent to disseminate information. Respect for an agency's value, worth and accountability is often judged on what is learned there. Integrity Consulting is working

with the agency on a fee for service basis, posting trainings and making Pay Pal accessible through the website.

Providing **professional quality of care** depends on licensure and evidence based accountability. The clinical director attended the following continuing education offering:

Florida Association for Play Therapy; Bringing Play Therapy into Supervision, Playing with Resilience and Strength, Attachment Based Storytelling in First Play. March 19 -21, 2015 in Daytona Beach, FL

Building - Duke Energy personnel wrote a grant for Child's Play Foundation to buy materials (fence posts, shingles, paint) and worked April 7 through April 9, 2015. Linda Kyler began the project in September of 2014. Over the 3 three days, Duke Energy employees replaced the roof on the gazebo, replaced the fence next to the parking lot. touched up the interior paint, cleaned off the roof, cleaned out the rain barrels, planted flowers, raked, weeded and served lunch. Fourteen Duke employees and two agency board members were involved in the project.

Personnel Penny Phares volunteered to oversee the office at Isaiah's Place one day per week, most weeks throughout the year. She provided counseling services on a fee for service basis for the Foundation, monitored and answered mail and emails and phone calls and facilitated 5 trainings. Penny continues to monitor the state requirements to maintain the nonprofit status and pay appropriate fees.

Joan Muller Memorial Fund – In 2012 the Board created the Joan Muller Memorial Fund, based on a large donation from Georgeann Miller in memory of her sister. The purpose of this fund is three fold;

- To provide an educational outreach and play therapy to young mothers and fathers who struggle with parenting young children.
- To provide training for the office and therapeutic staff as we serve our population and this agency in the changing economic environment.
- To update our existing technology to accommodate future needs.
